Summary:

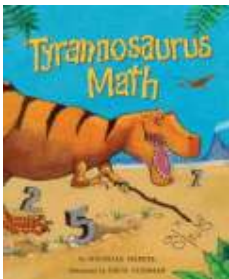

Summary:

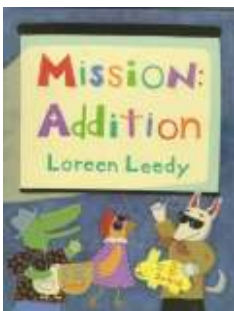

Summary:

A family is baffled when Uncle Victor, an ecologist, keeps sending a penguin a day to the house of his relatives. They quickly become overwhelmed trying to care for the increasing numbers, and use multiplication

Ten Sly Piranhas A Counting Story in Reverse

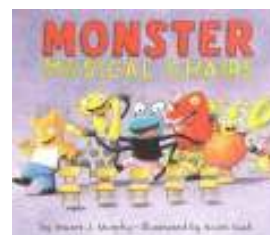
